Chiefs Corner

After a busy year in 2002 things were rather calm around the Firehouse in January. To date we've had only two fire calls, neither of which involved fire! We should enjoy it now while it's slow, because I'm willing to bet that things will pick up before we know it. Off-peak times are great to refresh your skills, check your tools, equipment, protective gear, and focus on being prepared for the calls that are certain to challenge us in the future. Every minute without a call draws us closer to the next one. Take time now to be ready when the tones drop again.

Training in the early part of the year tends to focus on meeting OSHA standards and safety issues. I believe that safety issues should be a part of every drill, and that "OSHA training" is not always held in a classroom. People learn by watching an instructor perform a task, and then practicing that skill until they understand and perfect it. That's a great way to teach safety in all aspects of our operations. The instructor discusses and demonstrates safe practices, and we should all practice and perform them in that safe fashion. Training in this fashion allows safety to become a habit and not an obligation.

Some of the tools and equipment ordered with our grant funds has arrived. Highlights include the pair Honda generator lights, most of the Survivor flashlights (one per SCBA), and an assortment of new hand tools. The ProPak foam unit, gloves, hoods, and helmets should be in before the end of January. Expected February arrivals may include the lightweight SCBA cylinders, rescue ropes, and Fire Reporting Software.

I would like to thank our Custodian, Dan Gerew, and Ed Clark for their recent efforts to clean the meeting room floor and truck bays. Let's try to keep things looking good. When washing apparatus indoors during the winter months, please make certain to flush the road grime and salt from the floor. Larger chunks of snow or slush may need to be removed by shovel.

I am pleased to announce that we have four new firefighters attending Basic Firefighter training this winter. Their number includes new members Ernie Corino, Torey Kaiser, Mark King, and Joe Rast. New member Megan Rice is taking her EMT class this winter, along with Chaplain and Vice-President Joe Perri. I encourage everyone to support our new members in their continuing education. As always, please take advantage of training opportunities in the area; course announcements are posted on the bulletin boards at the firehouse.

I am also pleased to announce that the Village Board has selected a bid to replace engine 2512. The new engine 2512 will be a Pierce Custom Contender, purchased
